From Judgement Hall to Judgement Hall

[Luke 23:7-11]

v.7) *“And as soon as he knew that he belonged unto Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, who himself also was at Jerusalem at that time.”*

[ASV] *“And when he knew that he was of Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him unto Herod, who himself also was at Jerusalem in these days.*

- Pilate saw the opportunity to make his problem, Herod's "problem.
- Herod – Herod Antipas; the same Herod who killed John the Baptist [Lk. 9:7-9]. He was son of Herod the Great, who had all the children of two years and younger to be killed in Bethlehem [Matt. 2:16]. He was uncle of Herod Agrippa who killed the apostle James with the sword, and would have killed Peter if he had not been miraculously rescued from prison [Acts 12:1,2].

v.8) *“And when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceeding glad: for he was desirous to see him of a long season, because he had heard many things of him; and he hoped to have seen some miracle done by him.”*

[ASV] *“Now when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceeding glad: for he was of a long time desirous to see him, because he had heard concerning him; and he hoped to see some miracle done by him.*

- You would think he would be ashamed to see James' cousin and leader after he executed him, but sin hardens the heart and we eventually have no shame. [Php. 3:17-19]
- hoped to have seen some miracle – Herod didn't want to learn from Christ he wanted to be entertained by Him. [Lk. 16:27-31]

v.9) *“Then he questioned with him in many words; but he answered him nothing.”*

[ASV] *“And he questioned him in many words; but he answered him nothing.”*
